Greater Victoria Flower Count Ends with 65 Billion Blossoms Counted

VICTORIA, B.C. – The 46th edition of the Greater Victoria Flower Count ended on March 10, 2021. Community and elementary school engagement were strong, with 65,245,471,605 blossoms counted over the week-long event.

The winner of "Bloomingest" community this year is the District of Highlands, with a total of 30,000,010,397 blossoms counted. The runner-up community this year is the District of Saanich with 23,144,617,119 blossoms counted.

Elementary school participation is a major component of Greater Victoria Flower Count. This year's winning elementary school class is Ms. Susan Holmes's class at Cordova Bay Elementary School in Saanich. Ms. Holmes's class counted 1,029,914,087 blossoms. Their prizes are individual passes to The Teahouse at Abkhazi Garden. Winners of the photo contest draw will be notified by end of day Wednesday, March 17, 2021.

"It was great to see the community come together for Greater Victoria Flower Count during these challenging times" said Paul Nursey, CEO - Destination Greater Victoria. "Our message this year was one of hope, renewal and rejuvenation. We want the rest of the country to know we are thinking of them. When the time is right, we will welcome them to our community again."
