BACKGROUNDER

Biographies:

Garrett Wang (pronounced Wong) is known most for his role as Harry Kim on "Star Trek Voyager." In addition to being a series regular on "Star Trek: Voyager," he was named one of People Magazine's 50 Most Beautiful People as well as one of E! Channel's "20 Coolest Bachelors." Since 2005, Garrett has been focused on traveling the world, working behind the scenes at DragonCon, designing scifi/fantasy inspired tee-shirts and relishing the role of an avid NFL Football fan.

Jim Duggan marched into the ring with a 2×4 slung over his shoulder for more than two decades. "Hacksaw" Jim Duggan defended America's honour and enjoyed distinction as one of the most recognizable superstars in the world. When the New York native joined Mid-South Wrestling in 1982, he began to develop the personality traits that fans love him for today. After battling Butch Reed for the rights to the nickname "Hacksaw," Duggan began carrying a 2×4 to the ring. The big man's block of wood became an iconic part of his persona, but its beginnings were practical. With fans being extremely overzealous and often dangerous at the time, Duggan's mentor, Bruiser Brody, suggested he lug a weapon to the ring to protect himself. "Hacksaw" grabbed a 2×4 and the rest is history. The 2×4 would be firmly in Duggan's grasp when he joined WWE in 1987. Duggan was inducted into the WWE Hall of Fame in 2011.

Tim Russ has been working within the entertainment industry for over thirty years. His talents encompass a wide spectrum of the performing arts including composing, music (guitar & vocals), acting, writing, directing, voice-over and producing. Mr. Russ received his B.S. in Theater at St. Edward's University Austin TX, and completed one year of post graduate work in theater at Illinois State University. Russ has also been active in the TV/Film directing arena with credits including the television series, "Star Trek: Voyager," and the feature films, "Life on the Rocks," "Junkie," "Night at the Silent Movie Theater," the pilot presentation "Renegades," the award-winning web series, "Bloomers," and a collection of short stories he has written and directed entitled, "Frame of Mind, Volumes I & II." Russ has also received an Emmy Award for his directing on several commercials for the FBI.

Dave Sheridan is best known for playing the dimwitted Officer Doofy in 2000's "Scary Movie." Sheridan has appeared in numerous films and TV shows throughout his career, including "Ghost World," "Robot Chicken," and "A Haunted House." He also starred on the MTV prank show "Buzzkill," a precursor to "Punk'd," which is often cited as one of the first reality-based series on the music network. Although not a recognizable name to audiences, Sheridan's memorable performance in the original "Scary Movie" has earned him cult status among fans, as well as dozens of film and TV credits.

Veronica Taylor is a classically trained actor who found her way into voice acting while performing in the Batman Stunt Show at Six Flags Great Adventure. She became a mainstay of Saturday morning cartoons, best known for playing the original Ash and May on the first eight seasons of "Pokémon," April on "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles" (2003-2007) and roles in "Yu-Gi-Oh!," "Cubix," "Dinosaur King," "Winx Club," "One Piece," and more with 4Kids. She has done numerous voices for animation, video games, audiobooks, commercials, and documentaries.

Felissa Rose (also known as Felissa Rose Esposito) grew up in New York always wanting to perform. At the age of 13, she landed a role in the cult film Sleepaway Camp (1983). At the age of 17, she applied for early admission to New York University's Tisch School of the Arts and was admitted that fall. Attending The Lee Strasberg institute, she began formal training as a serious actress.









Having appeared in over 150 films she's now producing and has a podcast called "Casualty Friday." Recent movies are "Hatchet 4: Victor Crowley," "Camp Dread," "A Nun's Curse," "Satan's Playground," "Terrifier 2," "Times Up," "Dark Circles and Silent Night," and "Zombie Night." Rose produced the and "Repentless" videos for metal band Slayer. Rose travels around the world doing comic cons and has many projects in development.

Lochlyn Munro was an accomplished and experienced actor from stage work when he jumped into the world of television and film with instant success. With over 200 credits to his name, Lochlyn is widely recognized for his memorable roles in such hit films as "Dead Man on Campus," "A Night at The Roxbury," "Scary Movie," "Freddy vs Jason," and "White Chicks" just to mention a few. Lochlyn is currently seen in the James Gunn HBO Max series, "Peacemaker," where he co-stars as Detective Fitzgibbon. He also recurs as Hal Cooper on CW's "Riverdale."
